

My name is Zachary Arms, and I am seeking the position of External Affairs officer in the Lehigh Graduate Student Senate. In addition, I will remain in contact with our fellow schools that are part of the National Association of Graduate-Professional students, which will help to keep on top of what legislation could affect us and will help create bonds of solidarity among those of us that share the experience of being a graduate student, be that at a public or private university. I will also work to keep the graduate student population up to date on what is occurring in the halls of government that could affect us, so that you will be informed.

This is a new office, and it will be shaped by those of us in the GSS and the broader Lehigh community into what would be the most effective, useful role for our needs. If you decide to elect me for this position, I look forward to working with you all in representing our interests to the outside world.
